Community Coordinators and Volunteers developed a consultation plan which included conducting a large online and paper survey of the Linton and District community regarding their wishes for Linton.

A series of meetings were then held, where the community decided that the most important priority for the town was to ensure the continued access to the Linton Community HUB for the town, plus ensuring that this building was made more accessible for those with special needs. This would involve forming a management committee for the HUB, and working with the GPSC to enable this to happen
