#### DRAFT BUDGET 2025/26 ONLINE FORUM ENGAGES COMMUNITY



The Online Forum will be an opportunity to learn more about the Draft Budget 2025/26 process, including: An outline of the Budget process, Budget timelines, feedback received through the recent Financial Plan consultation, information on how to lodge a Budget Submission, and Budget Submission timeframes which will be open until 9am, Friday 5 March 2025.
