Golden Plains Shire Council is currently seeking submissions as part of the 2025/26 Budget process.

This year, Council has brought forward the community engagement process to enable the consideration of community budget submissions during the development of the 2025-26 Budget.

An important part of the budget preparation is to invite the community to help shape the budget by lodging budget submissions. When preparing recommendations for the budget, all submissions

are considered while also taking into account the projected revenue, existing commitments, strategic priorities and community needs.

DON WALLACE RECREATION RESERVE OVAL UPGRADE OPEN

Golden Plains Shire Mayor Cr Sarah Hayden alongside Member for Eureka, Michaela Settle MP, officially opened the Don Wallace Recreation Reserve Oval upgrade in Teesdale.

The upgrade included the installation of an automated irrigation system with a new pump, subsurface drainage, realignment of oval boundary, new fencing

with concrete edging and new coach's boxes. New goal posts and behind goal safety netting have also been installed.

This \$798,000 project was funded with \$250,000 from the State Government's Country Football and Netball Program, with the remaining \$548,000 provided by Golden Plains Shire Council.
